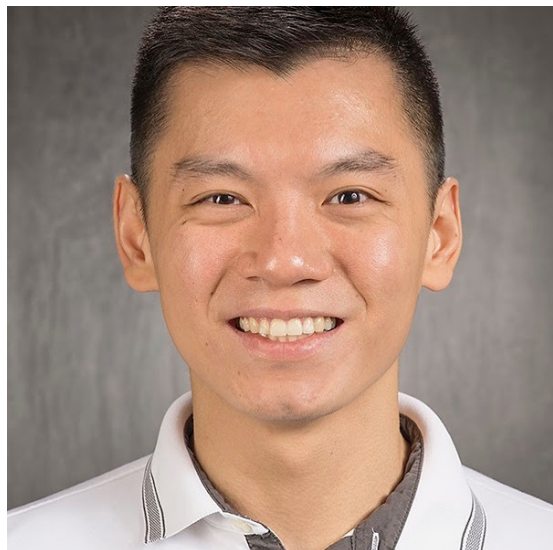


April Resident Physicians of the Month
